So, there are THREE TYPES of singing we are <u>directed to participate in</u> :		
Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual Songs. Let's consider Psalms -		
Psalm – "As the Deer panteth for the water, so my soul doeth long for Thee."		
Psalm – "Unto Thee oh Lord, do I lift up my soul Oh my God, I trust in Thee, Let me not be ashamed. Let not mine enemies triumph over me."		
Psalm – "I will call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised. So shall I be saved from my enemies. The Lord liveth, and blessed be the rock, let the God of my salvation be exalted"		
Using scripture from anywhere within your Bible, make a song out of it:

Consider: Deuteronomy 6:6-9/10-12 -		
⁶ "And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. ⁷ You		
shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in		
your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up.		
⁸ You shall <u>bind them</u> as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between		
your eyes. ⁹ You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

¹⁰ "So it shall be, when the LORD your God brings you into the land of which He swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to give you large and beautiful cities which you did not build, ¹¹ houses full of all good things, which you did not fill, hewn-out wells which you did not dig, vineyards and olive trees which you did not plant—when you have eaten and are full—¹² then beware, <u>lest you forget</u> the LORD who brought you out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage.

Ephesians 5 and the first of Chapter 6 take a look at <u>our relationships with</u>: **God, Others, Family,** *and* **Employers.** All of which are critical in being able to effectively implement the whole Armor of God.
